LEE COUNTY IMPACT FEE HEARING

Lee County Commissioners plan to adopt the impact fee collection rate and term at a public hearing on March 3rd. On February 3rd, the Commissioners approved the new study and staff recommendations on impact fees for roads, parks and schools. Fees are currently assessed at 20% but that discount rate is due to expire March 13th. Permit applications submitted by that date and issued by Sept. 11th will be entitled to the discount rate. This applies only to construction in unincorporated areas.

A proposal to assess a rate of 45% for the next three years was introduced at the February hearing and will be debated at the March 3rd hearing. An overview of the issue and economic implications will be provided at the February 10th REIS luncheon. The latest details on impact fees will be posted on the <u>REIS calendar</u> with links to backup materials.

COMMERCIAL LEASE TAX

Legislators are again considering eliminating or reducing Florida's 6% sales tax on commercial leases. Gov. Scott proposed the tax cut last year but it was tabled by the Legislature. The Governor did not include the cut in this year's budget proposal in favor of tax cuts for cell phones and satellite communications. Florida Realtors Association, the Florida Retail Federation, and NAIOP, a commercial developers group, argue that the cut in taxes on rent will be more effective in creating jobs. A bill has been filed in the Senate (SB 140), which would reduce the commercial lease tax rate to 5%.

WATER MANAGEMENT ISSUES

The annual <u>Southwest Florida Water Resources</u> <u>Conference</u> takes place Feb. 6th at Florida Gulf Coast University and will focus on stormwater management technologies and projects.

Southwest Florida Regional Planning Council has adopted strategic planning goals to address water storage and treatment in Lake Okeechobee and Caloosahatchee River watersheds.

<u>Water Conservation Expo & Vendor Fair</u> is Feb. 20th at South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) headquarters in West Palm Beach.

Lee County is considering diverting 20/20 Conservation management funds to Natural Resources to fund water management projects.

Florida Dept. of Environmental Protection (DEP) adopted a 10-year, \$750 million plan to reduce nutrients, primarily phosphorus, in Lake Okeechobee.

LOCAL ECONOMIC HIGHLIGHTS

The Horizon Council presented an overview of economic indicators at the annual meeting January 30th. Positive trends in Lee County in 2014 included:
